NOBLESVILLE HOMES RECEIVE 100 YEAR RECOGNITION

Noblesville, IN – The Noblesville Preservation Alliance, Inc. (NPA) recently awarded Century Plaques to four residences in Old Town Noblesville. All private residences, the structures are at least 100 years old.

They are:

1408 Logan Street - Charles M. Carlin House - circa 1894

355 South 9th Street - Charles W. Sowerwine - circa 1901

1148 Cherry - Mary J. Farley - circa 1889

1138 Cherry - Stephenson/Kraft - circa 1870/1897

There are now 10 homes that have received plaques since NPA initiated the Century Plaque program in 2000. Plaques include the builder's name and approximate construction date, and are installed on the front elevation of each home.

“Architectural preservation is very much a part of Noblesville’s unique character. This is just one way to bring attention to the value and importance of these treasures and how they contribute to the fabric of our community,” stated Carol Ann Schweikert, NPA President. “The Noblesville Library, the Hamilton County Historical Society and the County Courthouse in downtown Noblesville have extensive records available for researching the history of these homes. You learn the history of your home and become more connected to the community in the process,” she said.
